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OFFICE OF MINORITY STUDENT AFFAIRS TRIO MCNAIR SCHOLARS




Since 1990, the UIUC TRIO Ronald E. McNair Post-Baccalaureate Achievement Program (McNair Scholars Program) has provided research, mentoring, advising, and graduate school preparation opportunities for eligible sophomores, juniors and seniors to promote their academic excellence and pursuit of a PhD. TRIO McNair Scholars engage in rigorous research with faculty mentors, attend relevant workshops and seminars, and commit to preparing themselves for doctoral studies following the completion of undergraduate studies.

TRIO STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES




Designed to help first-generation colleges students, students with disabilities, and students with limited financial resources, TRIO Student Support Services (SSS) helps students with the transition from high school to college and eventually graduation. SSS has a solid record of success — the average graduation rate (more than 80 percent) for SSS students at Illinois is higher than the six-year average graduation rate for underrepresented students campus wide.

TRIO TALENT SEARCH




TRIO Talent Search has been in existence on the Illinois campus since September 1, 2011. Talent Search is designed to create and sustain a college-going culture for its target middle and high schools and to improve parents' capacity to prepare their children for college. Talent Search identifies and assists eligible individuals from the cities of Champaign, Decatur, and Urbana who have the potential to succeed in higher education.
